




We have received a further appreciation about Colin from Margaret Couchman:

Hot off the press (thank you Tony for holding these pages for us) we can share the news of a visit at the start of May from the President of Conference, Revd Sonia Hicks. A beautiful, sunny day meant that we could show off The Hive at Great Cressingham both inside and out.

Accompanied by Jacqui and the Chair of District, Revd Julian Pursehouse, Sonia joined us for a presentation on the outreach work at The Hive. Under the heading of, *Awakening*, she was given a taste of our many and varied activities — yoga, meditation, Celtic spirituality, the natural world, and music for body, mind and soul.

East Anglia District's Mission Enabler, Dr Yasmin Finch, spoke about the growing network of Methodist pioneers and how they are being supported by Connexion and encouraged as they try to find new ways of speaking to people about God. Yasmin brought the President's visit to a conclusion with an invitation to walk the labyrinth newly mown into the grounds surrounding The Hive. After walking (barefoot) to the centre, we returned with a small piece of green marble from Iona to remind us of the visit.

The President's theme for the year is, *God's Table: An Invitation for All*. She spoke about her passion for inclusivity, acceptance and welcome which chimes so well with our ethos at The Hive. "Don't be afraid of *different*," she said, "God finds space for all of us," and by respecting other people's outlook and opinions, "we can all grow."



A month earlier, at the beginning of April, we were invited to make a film about The Hive which was played at the District Synod in Ipswich. This was alongside two other pioneering projects and gave us the opportunity of sharing with Synod the exciting ways in which God is calling his church to change.

Our current season at The Hive is in full swing with the now familiar menu of varied events. From Sam: I'm sitting down to write this article on the afternoon of the last Thursday in April. I was in Blakeney this morning to lead morning prayers, followed by our weekly coffee morning. As I was driving back up Blakeney High Street, headed back to my office, I had to stop the car as there was a Muntjac deer trotting along the street in front of me, exploring people's gardens as it went. After a bit of exploring, it found a nice and lush looking garden to bounce into - I imagine the joy of the garden's owners won't match the joy of the deer in finding such a buffet! Further on in the same journey, I saw a Buzzard soaring gracefully above me. Sometimes I forget how very small and very rural the villages that I'm working in are, but my companions on the journey this afternoon reminded me that this is indeed where I have been called to serve for this season of my vocation. Two of the many things that I find really fulfilling about working in rural villages are the closeness of connection between humans and nature and the closeness of connection between people. Walking through either village I really enjoy stopping to chat to people, many of whom I've come to know during the last few years - sometimes we put the world to rights, sometimes they are going through a bit of a hard time and sometimes they put up with my terrible 'cracker' jokes! This 'sacred art' of neighbouring is, I think, incarnational ministry at its most humble. It is a privilege to walk alongside people, even if for a little while and one I am continually thankful to God for.

At Blakeney the community garden is really looking wonderful, with an array of spring flowers against the backdrop of the church, which is looking very smart with its newly painted woodwork. We've had visitors of all kinds, noticeably an increase in insects and birds who are enjoying the rich planting. Visitors of the two legged variety have been quite frequent too, often stopping to have a picnic on the benches. People have started to leave us messages in the garden book and it is often very touching to read that they have found peace and rest here. Recently I have bought a sun sail for the garden which will offer some shade during these lovely summer months (once we've worked out how to put it up!) and we look forward to continuing to build on the garden and its ministry.

In Walsingham it has been a joy to welcome visitors to the church once again, including Pilgrims, school groups, day trippers and holidaymakers. Many people in the village are keen to support us in promoting us as a place to visit, including local cafe owners and places to stay, which makes me hopeful for a busy summer. I have recently had some very encouraging conversations in ecumenical services, including one of the Carmelite Sisters from the Community of Our Lady of Walsingham and look forward to continuing to build those relationships as the year rolls round.

At Walsingham the church is open to visitors every Monday and Friday from 2pm - 4pm. If you've never visited Walsingham or the Methodist Church it makes a very pleasant afternoon trip. If you would like to visit outside these times please email us to arrange a visit (on the email address Glyn has shared) At Blakeney we'll be hosting a Tea in the Garden event, selling refreshments, cakes and books etc on Saturday 12th August from 2-4pm, it would be a lovely time to come and see the garden and enjoy some refreshments .


