Action for Children Report to Synod

Introduction

My report comes with heartfelt thanks to our Methodist family for your unwavering support. From April 2021 to March 2022, you raised over £644,300 to support Action for Children's work. We are touched by how you overcame the constraints of the pandemic and lockdown to raise such an incredible amount. We can't thank you enough.

Now that the worst of the pandemic is behind us, we are keen to reconnect with supporters. My colleagues and I have been excited to catch-up with old and new friends at events, such as the Methodist Women in Britain Residential (April) and their 10th anniversary garden party (June); the Joint Public Issues Team and Methodist Conferences (both in June).

Action for Children Sunday

We are grateful to churches that have held or plan to hold an Action for Children Sunday service. We hope that the material for young people helped them to explore how the theme, 'There's a star in every child' applies to them and other young people around them. Action for Children reaches over 670,000 in 2021-22

Results of our 2021-22 Reach survey showed that our services reached an amazing 671,275 children, young people and families, a significant increase from the previous year.

Our growing reach came against the backdrop of the impact of the pandemic on community-based services. Here are a few key figures:

- Mental health support reached 94,689 children, young people and parents or carers. This is an equivalent increase of 400% over the previous year.
- Parent Talk digital support reached over 400,000, an increase of 11%.
- Our children's centres, early help and family hubs increased their reach by 60% to over 102,000.

We are proud of these achievements and know we could not have made such an impact without supporters like you.

Sidekick - new text service for young carers

We have been piloting Sidekick, a confidential text messaging (SMS) service for young carers in UK aged between 13 and 18 (or up to 25 if they have additional needs). They can send a text at any time about anything and will get an answer back from a qualified support worker within 24 hours.



A young carer is someone under the age of 18 who looks after a family member who has a physical or mental health condition, or misuses drugs or alcohol. The Children's Society estimates there could be up to 800,000 – with many falling through the cracks.

Our own research shows young carers are reluctant to ask for help and to use 'crisis' support services because they often feel their situation is not important enough compared to the person they care for. So, we hope that Sidekick can offer them much needed support. Find our more here:

Cost of living crisis open letter

The cost of living crisis is a huge concern for everyone. We are taking several actions to urge the government to tackle the cost of living crisis. This includes an open letter to the Prime Minister asking him to restore benefits to a decent level; increase the child element of Universal Credit to help lift children out of poverty; and deliver a serious and crossgovernment strategy to tackle child poverty and making it a key part of the government's plans for levelling up.

Latest annual figures from the End Child Poverty Coalition, of which we are a member, show 3.6 million children are living in poverty in the UK, down 200,000 (-2%) on the year before. The results cover the period from 1 April 2020 to 31 March 2021 when millions of families were getting the £20 Universal Credit uplift, which experts say is the main reason the overall figure went down.

We are also collaborating with other organisations to take action, such as the Joint Public Issues Team and over 50 faith groups and charities who have endorsed the report 'Is cost of living support enough?' by Professor Donald Hirsch of Loughborough University.

Cash donations in £20 and £50 notes

In a couple of weeks, the Bank of England will take the old-style paper £20 and £50 notes out of circulation. Polymer versions, first introduced in February 2020, will replace them. The paper notes will be valid until 30 September 2022. Home Collection Box holders and anyone responsible for collecting cash donations need to be aware as only some banks will allow you to pay in the old notes after that date.
