## Secret Santa 2023 - £1.48m raised

Our Secret Santa fundraising exceeded its £1.4 million target, raising a staggering £1.48 million including gift aid, and we are still counting.

## Starry Night Gala

Our first fundraising gala was a night to remember with famous attendees and Methodist representatives, and incredible performances, including our very own Young Carers Aloud choir, led by celebrity vocal coach Charlotte Church. We raised over £150k.

Held on 30 November, the Starry Night gala took place at the stunning Grade II listed Battersea Arts Centre. It was an extraordinary evening of theatre and heartwarming moments, which raised vital funds to help give more children the safe and happy childhood they deserve.

'Children at the Table' - our general election coalition campaign



Launched on 24 January 2024, our coalition campaign with leading children's charities expresses our concerns that for too long, children have not been a priority for successive governments, or for political parties generally.

This means that more children are facing more challenges - babies going without support from health visitors; children growing up in poverty; and young people waiting months on a mental

health waiting list. These trends are going the wrong way.

That is why we have come together with other leading children's charities: Barnardo's, The Children's Society, the National Children's Bureau and NSPCC. Ahead of the upcoming general election, we must make sure the next Prime Minister does more to make good childhoods a national priority.

On 24 January, 25 young campaigners went to Parliament to tell MPs their vision for a better future. We surveyed 1,000 children and 1,000 adults and discovered that 62% of UK children think politicians don't understand the issues affecting them.

## Reunification: working alongside the NSPCC



Our Policy and Research Team worked with the NSPCC on a 'reunification' project - this is where children return home to their family from care.

This January, Action for Children launched a new policy report in partnership with NSPCC, on the importance of reuniting children who leave care with their families. More children leave the care system by returning home than through any other route. Sadly, this move back home often fails, meaning lots of children return to care.

To make sure that children who return home continue to stay with their families and do not reenter care, we recommend that national reunification guidance is developed and investment in reunification practice evaluations across England should be made.
